




#### DID YOU KNOW RABBITS...


- are also called bunnies (or one bunny).
- are mammals with big ears, excellent hearing, whiskers, soft fur and a short tail.
- eat plants such as: grass, twigs, leaves and bark.
- are small animals that dig holes and tunnels that are called "burrows."
- live underground in burrows connected together to form a warren.
- thump to warn other rabbits of danger.
- take good care of themselves with grooming.
- · can freeze in an instant and flatten their bodies so no one can see them.
- have very powerful hind legs for digging and can run 24 miles an hour.
- live in forests, deserts, grasslands and swamps all over the world, except Antarctica.

#### There are at least 25 different species or kinds of bunnies. Here are three to color.




I am an Eastern Cottontail Rabbit. I live in Ohio. Color me brownish gray with a rusty colored neck and a white cotton tail.

#### THE POWER OF WIND!

The RUNAWAY BUNNY tells his mom that he will become a sailboat to sail away from her, but she said she will become the wind and blow him to wherever she wants him to go!

Wind, even if it is your breath, can be very powerful. Sailboats have a large piece of material that is blown by the wind to make the boat move. Try this experiment. Make a pinwheel, then use your breath to blow the wheels around.

#### SUPPLIES NEEDED:


- 1. Paper, any color, size of square to the right.
- Scissors.
- 3. Crayons or markers to decorate the paper.

- 4. Push Pin.
- 5. Pencil with an eraser.
- 6. Your breath.

#### DIRECTIONS:

- Trace the square to the right, on a piece of paper.
- 2. Be sure to put the lines, dot, and numbers in the same places, on your square.
- 3. Color both sides of the paper.
- 4. Cut along the 4 DARK diagonal lines.
- 5. Bend the 1st numbered corner to the center dot.
- 6. Bend the 2nd numbered corner on top of the first.
- Bend the 3rd numbered corner on top of the second.
- 8. Bend the 4th numbered corner on top of the third.
- 9. Carefully insert a push pin through all the papers in the center, holding them together.
- 10. Insert the pinwheel and the push pins into the eraser on the top of the pencil.

11. Gently blow towards the push pin and watch the pinwheel go around. demonstrating the power of your wind (or breath)!

The last line above comes from a famous Mother Goose Nursery Rhyme, which is printed below. The rhyme has all sorts of funny images, like a cow jumping over the moon.


