


Besides being Broadway stars, Miss LuPone and Mr. Patinkin have much in common:

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Both were named for relatives: Mandel Bruce Patinkin was named for his grandfather.

Miss LuPone was named for her greatgrand-aunt Adelina Patti, the celebrated 19th-century opera singer.

Both performed as children: Miss LuPone was trained in dance and was part of a singing trio with her twin brothers during the 1960s.



As a boy, Mr. Patinkin sang in his school's choir and participated in community theater.

Both have lived in New York:

Mandy Patinkin was born in Chicago and attended the University of Kansas for two years, then headed off to NYC in 1972.

Miss LuPone was born in Long Island, New York.

Both attended the Juilliard School of Drama:

Patti LuPone attended the Juilliard School of Drama four years before Patinkin. Upon graduation, she joined John Houseman's renowned The Acting Company where she appeared on and off Broadway, as well as in touring shows all over the United States ranging from Shakespeare to Molière to Mamet.

After Patinkin attended Juilliard, Joseph Papp gave him his first Broadway role in Trelawny of the Wells at Lincoln Center in 1975, with Meryl Streep and John Lithgow.

Both have been involved in humanitarian efforts:

Mr. Patinkin supports organizations including Doctors Without Borders, Americans for Peace Now, The September 11th Fund, Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of America and Gilda's Club. A cancer survivor, he supports the Prostate Cancer Foundation and health awareness.

Miss LuPone has received the Equality Advocate Award for her efforts in the fight against AIDS.

Both enjoy versatile careers:

LuPone is known for every type of entertainment from opera to Broadway to concerts to film and TV. Just like Mr. Patinkin, Miss LuPone has had great success with the solo concert stage, appearing with the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, Chicago

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Symphony Orchestra, San Francisco's Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra, and at the Kennedy Center, Australia's Sydney Festival and London's Donmar Warehouse.

Patinkin's incredible versatility as actor, singer, and dancer have given him an impressive resume filled with musicals, comedies, dramas, feature films, TV shows, concerts, Shakespeare...you name it, he's done it!

Both love working with each other:


Miss LuPone said to *Playbill.com*, "I adore him, and so I adore working with him onstage. He's dangerous onstage, and I love the fact that he's dangerous, and yet we're safe in each other's arms."

Mr. Patinkin agreed in the *Philadelphia Gay News*, "She's a dear old friend, and I love her deeply. Being with her is as good as it gets in theater."

How AN EVENING WITH PATTI LUPONE AND MANDY PATINKIN got started:

LuPone recently told *Playbill.com* how it began, "There was a booker in Richardson, Texas — they were opening a brand-new performing arts center — who called my agent at ICM Artists and said, 'I got Mandy, how about Patti?' and then called Mandy's agent and said, 'I have Patti, how about Mandy?' And he put us together after 25 years. So I got a call from Mandy, who said, 'I don't want to just do, you sing a song and I sing a song, and then we do a duet.' I was doing *Noises Off* at the time, and I said, 'Mandy I can't partake in the development of this.' He said, 'I'll do it. I want to do it.' I said, 'Great, do it.' And we did it, and then we didn't do it for five years. And then all of a sudden it happened again. I guess the idea of Mandy and me being onstage together again is generating enough excitement that we're getting booked all over the place."

THE COMPOSERS OF AN EVENING WITH PATTI LUPONE AND MANDY PATINKIN

Many of LuPone's and Patinkin's favorite songs are featured in this concert. The composers of these songs have written some of the most enduring music for the stage.

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Who are these paragons of musical theater? Berlin, Sondheim and Styne, Kern and Hammerstein. Rodgers and Hammerstein, Webber and Rice, Menken and Rice, Ashman and Menken, Kander and Ebb. Their names not only evoke the very best of Broadway, but also some of the greatest American music from the 20th century: show tunes, pop songs, film



scores, ballads, love songs, and dance numbers, these composers and lyricists have done it all!

Their songs have been sung by Broadway and Hollywood superstars, top recording artists and concert performers such as Frank Sinatra, Natalie Cole, and Barbra Streisand. These composers have won Tony Awards, Oscars, Emmy Awards, Pulitzer Prizes, Drama Desk Awards, Gold Records, Golden Globes, Grammy Awards, and countless other honors. These composers *are* American Musical Theater.


Jerome Kern famously declared, "Irving Berlin has no place in American music - he is American music." Having penned our nation's unofficial national anthem "God Bless America," Berlin went on to write over three thousand songs including the scores for Tony Award winning Annie Get Your Gun and Call Me Madam.

Jerome Kern and Oscar Hammerstein's 1927 Showboat was a departure from the revues and operettas that previously dominated Broadway. Showboat and later Hammerstein's 1943 Oklahoma! introduced the standard for combining of story, music, and dance to create the musical theater that exists today.

When Kern left to write for Hollywood, Hammerstein collaborated with another composer, Richard Rodgers. Together they wrote *Carousel*, *South Pacific*, *Oklahoma!* and some of the most successful and popular musicals of all time.

Stephen Sondheim grew up as a neighbor to Oscar Hammerstein II when he was writing *Oklahoma!* As Hammerstein's personal assistant, young Sondheim found his passion. Over the years he has written the shows *Gypsy, Company, Sweeney Todd, Into the Woods*, and *Passion*, filled with literate lyrics and a nod to classical composers Ravel and Debussy.

Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice wrote Jesus Christ Superstar, a combination of classical and popular music. Next for Webber and Rice came Tony award winning




Evita, where LuPone and Patinkin first met. Evita combined elements of rock, jazz, and choral music, as well as Latin American rhythms.

Ashman and Menken, probably best known for Disney movie musicals *The Little Mermaid* and *Beauty and the Beast* combined calypso, jazz, and Arabic flavors in their music. When Howard Ashman died, Alan Menken collaborated with Tim Rice.

In 1966 John Kander and Fred Ebb joined forces with long time Sondheim director Harold Prince on their stunning, critically acclaimed, Tony award winning musical *Cabaret* that in 1972 lead to an Academy award winning movie adaptation.

Patti LuPone and Mandy Patinkin have navigated the musical theater world with great success through the music of these composers. Listen for some of their incredible songs performed by this distinguished and dynamic Broadway duo in this special EVENING WITH PATTI LUPONE AND MANDY PATINKIN.




